


CHILESE NEW YEAR








- * Hanukkah lasts for eight nights, to commemorate how long the holy light burned.
- * A Menorah (a candelabra with nine candles) is lit each night of the holiday.
- * There is no "wrong" way to spell Hanukkah. There is no correct way to directly translate the Hebrew sounds to English, it could be spelled a variety of different ways, each equally correct.
 - * The famous dreidel, or four-sided spinning top, was invented as a distraction.h










Diwali is a festival of lights in India. It is one of the major festivals celebrated by Hindus, Jains, Sikhs and some Buddhists.

FAST FACTS

- * Diwali, or Dipawali, is India's biggest and most important holiday of the year.
 - The festival usually lasts five days.
- The festival gets its name from the row (avali) of clay lamps (deepa) that Indians light outside their homes to symbolize the inner light that protects from spiritual darkness.

THE 5 DAYS OF DIWALI


DAY ONE: People clean their homes and shop for gold or kitchen utensils to help bring good fortune.

DAY TWO: People decorate their homes with clay lamps and create design patterns called rangoli on the floor using colored powders or sand.


DAY THREE: On the main day of the festival, families gather together for Lakshmi puja, a prayer to Goddess Lakshmi, followed by mouth-watering feasts and firework festivities.

DAY FOUR: This is the first day of the new year, when friends and relatives visit with gifts and best wishes for the season.

DAY FIVE: Brothers visit their married sisters, who welcome them with love and a lavish meal.








The Japanese New Year is a traditional festival which has been celebrated for centuries and has its own unique customs.

FAST FACTS


- * Osechi-ryōri is a New Year traditional food in Japan. It's basically a huge bento box of delicious food items.
- The sticky white dumpling made from rice is called Mochi and during the New Year, Japanese make a special shape from Mochi turning it into "Kagami Mochi".
- On hatsumode (the first shrine visit of the year), people in Japan visit the shrine or temple around midnight on New Year's Eve to pray to the gods for a good year to come.


- * The holiday is mostly celebrated by African-Americans in the United States.
