is not a perfectly round planet!

While the Earth appears perfectly round when viewed from space, the earth's rotation causes the planet to bulge at the equator and flatten at the poles, which means the earth is not perfectly uniform in its shape.

is made up of four layers - the crust, the mantle, the outer core and the inner core.





has an estimated population of 8.1 billion people (as at 1 January 2024).







Earth Day - How can you help save your home planet!

Reduce, Re-use and Recycle ...



Switch off electrical items like your games console and TV when not using them and lights when you leave a room - reducing your electricity usage.



If it is safe to do so, walk, cycle or take a bus instead of asking your parents to drive you - reducing the fuel your parents use.



Turn off the tap when brushing your teeth - to save precious clean water.



Take shorter showers and don't leave taps dripping - every drop counts.



Take your own bags when shopping and encourage your parents to do the same thing when they go shopping.

Gift unwanted items to charity - ensure they are in good, clean condition.

Think before you throw - can the item you are throwing away be recycled?


Start a compost pile or worm farm and take your kitchen scraps out to feed the pile/ worms.
